What is the BFI?

The French baccalaureate with an emphasis on languages and cultures

14 different languages: Arabic, Chinese, Danish, Dutch, English (American, Australian, British), German, Italian, Japanese, Norwegian, Polish, Portuguese and Brazilian Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Swedish



BFI specific courses and hours

5 extra hours for a minimum of 8 hours taught in a foreign language

FRENCH "BACCALAURÉAT **GÉNÉRAL**"

* In German sections, 2 hours of history and geography are taught in French and 4 hours are taught in German.

In Chinese sections, history and geography are taught in French and 1.5 hour of mathematics in Chinese is added.


